## Thy Kingdom Come . . .

Have you ever thought about the things we

sing, pray, and say during worship? I really don't like to sing "I Surrender All." I feel like I'm lying when I sing it. I WANT to surrender all, but I haven't yet. To say that I do, in a song to my Lord, is very discomforting.

Or, when I say I will pray for someone I feel very uneasy. I do intend to pray for them. But, how many times have I remembered a few days, a week, or longer after I have made the vow that I didn't fulfill said vow.

Or, when I pray, "Thy Kingdom come . . . ." Now, I

understand that God has to bring His Kingdom to us, but I also know that we Christians have a responsibility to be part of the means by which God brings the message of the Good News to the rest of the world. This is a tremendous aspect of His Kingdom coming into our world. I want to be part of that, but . . . sometimes I am not faithful or obedient.

So, can you relate to any of this? The good news, so to speak, is that even if we have failed on many occasions, we can get back to what we are supposed to be doing and become those instruments God can use to bring His Kingdom to bear on this world.

First, Who is Your ONE? If you haven't already, ask God to identify that one person in

your circle of influence for whom you can be praying. Also, ask God to give you an opportunity to have Gospel conversations with them, and that He will use these conversations to lead him/her to Christ.

Second, has your church ever considered planting a church? I have been convicted lately that in all these years I never led the church I pastored to plant a church. There is a great need for more churches throughout our county and region. Perhaps it is time for us to think about having healthy churches plant more healthy churches.

Lastly, our IMB is begging for short-term volunteers to help our personnel on the field. This would be a great opportunity for a graduating senior to go on the field for 2 weeks and help with a Christian camp, or for a college graduate to commit to a two-year stint as a journeyman/woman. Also, there are ample opportunities for senior citizens, too! I am convinced that we have not exceeded our sending-capacity in these areas.

If we get back to what we are instructed in God's Word to do, perhaps we won't feel as conflicted when we sing certain songs, make certain vows, or pray certain prayers. And, we really do want to see His Kingdom Come, don't we?
